



Information for Grade 12's

Part of your job right now is planning for your life after high school. This may mean checking out job opportunities, planning a trip or applying to universities and/or college. Start discussing this with your parents and realistically thinking about your options. If you are uncertain, TRU offers aptitude testing and career counselling (250-828-5023). Most universities start accepting applications on October 1st. Some have early admission and early scholarship deadlines. Many universities have their own entrance awards, TRU for example has many entrance scholarships based on both grades and service to others.

BCeID

It is important that you sign up for a BCeID, this will allow you to order and send transcripts to post secondary institution. Please see attached for step by step directions. There is also a link on the Sahali Secondary website that have several videos that can support you in completing your BCeID

How to get Scholarship Information

To get scholarship information sent directly to your phone, text this message@fa668h to this number (289)271-0166. **Our school and District scholarship processes will not start until spring (the deadline is May 1st).** If you want to review the process and application you are welcome to look at last year's information and documents (updated in March), which are found on the school website. Please don't submit an old applications, please wait Until March for this year's application package

Community Scholarships

Community scholarships (Ex. McDonald's, Rotary, Banks, RIH, Employers) have their own process and deadlines, these are separate from the school. Post-Secondary Institutions

Students hoping to continue to post-secondary education should be actively doing research online about prospective universities and programs. University and colleges are accepting applications for next September now, even though they don't have your grade 12 marks. Some will admit students based on the Grade 11 marks. Some will ask you to self-report your grades, while others will request a copy of your first term report card. We recommend waiting for your first term marks to be reported before requesting a transcript. Transcript request forms are available in the counseling office

Tips for Completing your Scholarship Application Letters

Technical Aspects (What is should look like)

- Include date
- Who is the letter addressed to (be specific as possible)
- End letter with a salutation and sign with a black pen
- Use paragraphs
- Must look good (remember this is the primary thing they associate with your application)
- Clear legible letterhead
- Include email addresses when appropriate
- Single sided
- Single or 1.5 spaced
- Clear and easy to read font

Content of Letter

The purpose of this letter is to highlight your strengths and accomplishments. It should also identify your future goals and how you plan to achieve those goals. It is a way for people to connect who you are to your application.

- Your letter should be 3-4 paragraphs depending on the content of your letter. Paragraph three could be separated into two paragraphs.

Paragraph 1

Introduce yourself and indicate what award you are applying for. Also highlight why you think you deserve the award. What makes you different than other applicants? Don't be humble, this is a place to showcase your strengths, and what makes you the best candidate for the award.

Paragraph 2

Talk about yourself and the activities you have been involved in. Please don't just provide a list of activities; showcase how the activities have helped build skills and strengths within you. For example, if you play volleyball, basketball, soccer, and participate in swimming, you could summarize this involvement by saying "During my time in secondary school I have been involved in a variety of school and community sports. Through this involvement I have learned to effectively manage time and have developed an understanding of the time and effort required to successfully complete my goals".

Paragraph 3

What are your future goals and how do you plan on achieving them. Also thank the donor for taking the time to review your application.

Reference Letter

- Make sure you have letters when required
- Timeline for references: please give writer at least week

Transcript

- See Mrs. Salituro in the counseling office/set up a BCEID. All transcripts can be ordered online and sent to a post secondary institution.



Sahali Secondary Scholarships & Bursaries

2020

This is a comprehensive list of external scholarships/bursaries that are available to Sahali Secondary graduate. Please make sure you meet eligibility requirements before applying. Also make sure you have properly completed the application packages, and enclosed all required documents. Please see Ms. Trimble in the counselling office if you need support doing this. School District and Sahali Secondary Scholarships have a separate application package which will be available in February.

The BC Excellence Scholarship

This \$5000 award is for students who show excellence in academics, volunteering and leadership. This must be demonstrated both in and out of the classroom. In BC, 55 students will be chosen for this award.

Our school can only submit one nominee for this award. In order to be eligible students must be a Canadian Citizen, have a minimum “B” average in grades 11 and 12 and have volunteered in the school and community. Students interested in being considered as this year’s nominee need to hand in responses to the four parts below (in an envelope) by January 19, 2020. The awards committee will determine the nominee by January 26th. Students are strongly advised to visit the Ministry of Education website to view the full application process:

BC Achievement Scholarships

This scholarship is awarded to students in BC who have the highest cumulative average in both required and elective courses. This average is based on achievement in course sin grade 10, 11 and 12. This scholarship is valued at \$1250 and must be used towards post-secondary tuition. In order to be eligible students must achieve a “B” (73%) in their English 12 course. A student can receive only one BC Achievement Scholarship in their lifetime.

There is no need to apply for the BC Achievement Scholarships. All students who meet the criteria for the Scholarship are automatically considered for the award.

Secondary School Apprenticeship Scholarships

These \$1,000 scholarships are awarded to graduating secondary school apprentices who:

- Have been registered in a school district Secondary School Apprenticeship Program (SSA) prior to graduation,
- Successfully complete MURK 11A, MWRK 11B, MWRK 12A, and MWRK 12B),
- Maintain a C+ average or better in their Grade 12 numbered courses, and
- Reported a total of at least 900 hours to the ITA within six months of graduation.

There is no need to apply for Secondary School Apprenticeship Scholarships. All students who meet the criteria for the Scholarship are automatically considered for the award.

Loran Scholarship

This award is for students who show excellence in character, service and leadership. This must be clearly demonstrated both in and out of the classroom. As well, students must have a minimum average of 85% over the past three years of school. Although this is the minimum, our nominees usually have an average of 90% or higher. The application process for those nominated has an extensive and time consuming process so students are strongly encouraged to read the information on the Loran website <http://www.loranscholar.ca> before submitting an application.

Our school can take a maximum of three nominees for the Loran. You can also apply to the “direct pool” if you are not nominated. Students interested in being considered as one of this year’s nominees need to hand in typed responses to the four parts below (in an envelope) by noon on Tuesday October 8, 2019. The awards committee will determine our nominees by Friday October 11, 2019. Deadline for online application by nominees is Thursday October 17.

Nomination Application

Part One

List the grade 10, 11 and 12 academic classes you have taken, as well as your final grade in each class. Also list any academic course you are taking the second semester.

Part Two

List and describe the activities that demonstrate your service to others since 2017 (both community and school)

Part Three

In sentence form, describe what you consider to be your most significant volunteer contribution to date in terms of its value to your school or larger community (150 words max.)

Part Four

In sentence form, describe the leadership role that was most challenging for you. What steps did you take to reach your goal? What did you learn about yourself (150 words max.)

Schulich Scholarship

This award is for students who show excellence and passion in the STEM subjects (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics). This passion must be demonstrated both in and out of the classroom. As well, students must be applying to one of the following universities: University of Victoria, York, Dalhousie, Laval, Queen's, Simon Fraser University, Western, uOttawa, University of Calgary, Université de Montréal, McMaster, Waterloo, University of Alberta, UBC, Memorial, University of Saskatchewan or McGill.

Our school can only submit one nominee for this award. Nominees must possess two of these three criteria: academic excellence, leadership, or financial need. Students interested in being considered as this year's nominee need to hand in a typed response to the three parts below (in an envelope) by Friday December 13, 2019. The awards committee will have our nominee determined by Wednesday December 18, 2019. Students are advised to visit the Schulich website for further details:

Part One

List the grade 11, 12 science, math or technology classes you have taken, as well as your final grades in each class. Also list any related course you may be taking the second semester.

Part Two

List and describe the activities that demonstrate your leadership and passion beyond the classroom in the STEM subjects (max. 150 words).

Part Three

Referring to two of the three criteria you possess, explain why you should be our school's Schulich nominee and how it might impact your future goals.

TD Scholarship For Community Leadership

This scholarship is available to students who have shown exceptional initiative in making a meaningful and lasting difference in their community. TD is interested in students who have demonstrated consistent and outstanding dedication to solving a community problem or making their community a better place. This scholarship has an extensive interview process, and applications for the 2019-2020 year will be open until November 15, 2019.

Terry Fox Humanitarian Award

This award is designed to honor the spirit of Terry Fox, by encouraging young Canadian to emulate Terry Fox's courage and determination by providing their communities and those in need with humanitarian service. Applicants must provide three (3) referees and upload online an (un)official transcript detailing the applicant's last two years of schooling (official transcripts will be requested from applicants who are selected for an interview). This scholarship has an extensive interview process, applications must be submitted online before Feb. 1. Please see <http://terryfoxawards.ca/> for more information.

TRU Entrance Scholarships

General Undergraduate Entrance Scholarships

Applicants must be enrolling in a TRU degree program or a two-year program. The minimum academic requirement is an 80% average in four Grade 12 academic subjects including English 12 (Grade 11 academic subjects may also be used).

Deadline: March 1

Alvin & Lydia Grunert Entrance Scholarship

Award of \$30,000 (renewable over four years)

The Alvin & Lydia Grunert Entrance Scholarship recognizes documented exemplary leadership and community service combined with solid academic performance based on secondary school averages in the core subjects. The recipient will meet all of the requirements for TRU undergraduate entrance scholarships.

Deadline: March 1

TRU Ambassador's Entrance Scholarship

Awards of approximately \$22,000 (full standard undergraduate tuition & fees, renewable over four years)

The Ambassador's Entrance Scholarship recognizes documented exemplary leadership and community service combined with solid academic performance based on secondary school averages in the core subjects. Students offered this scholarship may also accept the responsibility of student leadership activities during the academic year.

Deadline: March 1

TRU Leadership Entrance Scholarship

Awards of \$5,000 each

The Leadership Entrance Scholarship recognizes documented leadership and community service combined with solid academic performance based on secondary school averages in the core subjects.

Deadline: March 1

TRU President's Entrance Scholarship

Awards of \$5,000 each

Minimum of 15 awardsThe TRU President's Entrance Scholarship recognizes student academic excellence based on admission averages in the top four Grade 12 academic courses, including an academic English (the equivalent Grade 11 academic subject will be used in each case where a Grade 12 course is in progress).

Deadline: March 1

TRU Community Engagement Entrance Scholarship

Awards of \$2,000 each

The Community Engagement Entrance Scholarship recognizes documented community service combined with solid academic performance based on secondary school averages in the core subjects.

Deadline: March 1

TRU Potential Entrance Awards

Awards of up to \$4,000

15 awards available

These awards are available to students entering any TRU undergraduate program who demonstrate exceptional potential. Applicants will describe the vision of their future at TRU and how they wish to realize it. Applicants must elaborate on their past experiences and accomplishments which are indicative of their ability to unleash their untapped potential through a TRU education.

Deadline: April 1

TRU Regional Entrance Awards

Awards of \$3,000

These awards are available to students graduating from secondary schools within the TRU region outside of the City of Kamloops. Awards are given based on student involvement and service within their secondary school and/or their community, and require a 70% overall average in Grade 12. Students must be admitted to a degree, diploma, or 8-month ladderable certificate. Preference will be given to applicants who are the first person in their immediate family to attend post-secondary education (first generation student). Awards will seek to achieve diversity in geographic areas and by TRU faculty & school.
