Achievement Recognition

- SABRE PRIDE Recognition (Grade 8 through 12)
- Grad Program Honour Roll (Grade 10, 11, 12)
- Principals List
- Students will be recognized for their achievement at the end of each semester.
- Courses that produce a final grade will be included in Honour Roll calculations.

Grade 8-12

SABRE PRIDE Recognition

- GRIT Honour Roll will be recognized for students who have been nominated by staff members in our building.
- Students will be nominated based on an **outstanding** display of: **GROWTH MINDSET, RESILIENCE, INTEGRITY, and TIME MANAGEMENT**
- Students will be recognized at the end of each semester.

Grade 10, 11 and 12

Academic Achievement Recognition

- Student must have **80% or higher** in every course based on **final marks** for each final reporting period every semester.
- Students must also have a **minimum of three assessed/authorized courses** in each reporting semester.

Principals list

- Grade 10, 11, 12
 - o This is an annual recognition of outstanding achievement for students in **Grades 10-12**. Eligibility will be determined based on the following criteria:
 - Student must have **86% (A) or higher in each course** based on **marks in Semester 1 and Term 3**
 - Student must have a minimum of **six assessed/authorized courses** over the school year.

Gold Cord

- Gold Cord will be presented each year at Graduation Commencement ceremonies. Eligibility is based on both historical and current year marks data as defined below:
 - o **Must maintain Principals List Status for Gr. 10/11/12.**
 - o **Grade 12 – Semester 1 and Term 3**

Red Cord

- Red Cord will be presented each year at Graduation Commencement ceremonies. Students who are in the top 5% of their grad class will be recognized with a red cord achievement.

Nomination Process

- Students will be nominated confidentially by staff. Final decisions will be made by the Scholarship Committee.

Major Awards

- **Sa-Hali Spirit Award**
 - o The Sa-Hali Spirit award recognizes the most well-rounded graduate. This encompasses academic achievement, school involvement and serving the school community. This student is highly academic and is involved in service in at least two areas of the school.
- **Reno Fabbro Award**
 - o Reno Fabbro was the first Principal at Sa-Hali Secondary. The Reno Fabbro award recognizes a graduating student who overcame significant challenges or adversity.
- **The Cowden Award**
 - o Bob Cowden was a Principal at Sa-Hali Secondary and Joan Cowden was a long-standing school Trustee. The Cowden Award recognizes a student(s) who has participated in substantial volunteerism and service while attending Sa-Hali Secondary School.
- **Tony Embleton Award**
 - o Tony Embleton was the second Principal at Sa-Hali Secondary. The Tony Embleton award recognizes a senior student(s) who has demonstrated outstanding citizenship.
- **Laurie Phipps Award**
 - o Laurie Phipps was a CEA at Sa-Hali Secondary for many years and valued community, connection, perseverance, and generosity. The Laurie Phipps award recognizes a junior student(s) who demonstrates outstanding citizenship.
